<b>Position Duties and Responsibilities:</b>
<p>This position is located in the U.S. Department of Labor (DOL), Employment and Training Administration (ETA), Office of Workforce Investment (OWI) Office of Youth Services (OYS), Division of Field Services and Technical Assistance. The Office of Youth Services is responsible for serving as the national advocate for comprehensive youth development services so that all youth, particularly those most disadvantaged, have the academic, technical and work readiness skills they need to successfully transition to adulthood, careers and post-secondary education and training.</p> <p>The incumbent will be responsible for a wide range of program development and program accountability activities in support of the agency’s operation of youth programs. Provides leadership, guidance and direction as it relates to education, including coordination between the Department of Labor and the Department of Education in implementing the No Child Left Behind legislation. The incumbent will also be responsible for coordinating and improving the educational and literacy components of Youth Opportunity Grants, Youth Offender Demonstration Grants, and other Discretionary Youth Grants funded by DOL. Develops national guidelines to increase the proportion of youth who obtain high school diplomas, including efforts to improve alternative schools supported through DOL funds and to expand the use of credit retrieval programs in projects funded by DOL.</p>

<p>Applicants must have one year (52 weeks) of specialized experience which is in or directly related to the line of work such as, program development, program accountability, and policy formulation activities. To be creditable, specialized experience must have been at least equivalent to next lower grade level GS-12 in the Federal Service. The Group Coverage Qualifications Standards for Administrative and Management Positions, as published by the Office of Personnel Management, in the Qualifications for General Schedule Positions. Time in grade requirements must be met by the closing date of this announcement.</p>

## METHOD OF EVALUATION

The candidate's experience, training, awards and performance appraisal will be considered in the evaluation process. It is the responsibility of the applicant to provide all of the information needed by the closing date of this announcement. Current and/or past supervisors may be contacted unless specified otherwise. Applicants may be interviewed by a panel and/or the selecting official or his/her designee.

**EVALUATION FACTORS: Factors designated (H) are rated high.**

1. In-depth knowledge of youth employment and training programs, including federal youth programs operated under the Workforce Investment Act, in order to provide leadership and guidance.
2. Working knowledge of the No Child Left Behind legislation and issues relating to its potential impact on disadvantaged youth.
3. In-depth knowledge of alternative education programs, including literacy training and credit retrieval, in order to coordinate and improve the educational literacy components.
4. Demonstrated ability to coordinate with other organizations, and carry out projects from a planning stage through implementation.
5. Experience in organizing and conducting training workshops.

If no degree, include total credits earned and indicate whether semester or quarter hours. Do not send transcripts unless checked below.
- To receive credit for relevant training, list seminar/course titles, dates, number of hours and name of the institutions from which training was received.
- Description of honors, awards, and special qualifications such as language skills, computer skills along with dates acquired, if relevant to position.
- If applying for reinstatement or transfer, attach a copy of the appropriate SF-50, Notification of Personnel Action, which confirms your status.
