

**GRANTEE:** Mexican American Alcoholism Program, Inc. (MAAP)

**AMOUNT:** \$660,000 (Federal Direct) + \$684,145 (Non-Federal Match) = \$1,344,145 (Total)

**DURATION:** 12 months

**POPULATION SERVED/RECRUITMENT:** Services will be offered to 200 participants. The program will be promoted throughout California's 32 state prisons and the Sacramento county jails.

**BRIEF DESCRIPTION:** The Project is collaboration among six faith-based organizations and community based agencies, providing services to individuals returning to Sacramento County. Priority acceptance into the program will be given to veterans. Mentoring services will be offered to participants prior to release. Vouchers will be used to supplement the training accounts available through the local One-Stop, and for vocational classes and training through the school districts, including classes on auto repair, truck driver training, optometric and administrative assistant training, and desktop publishing.

**NON-FEDERAL MATCH:** Total of \$684,145 in non-federal resources will be leveraged as follows: MAAP offers \$330,145 in existing services for outpatient and residential substance abuse treatment, primary medical and dental care, and HIV testing; \$128,000 from Sacramento Veteran's Resource Center for substance abuse treatment services; Prison Fellowship offers in-kind services of pre-release classes and recruitment at \$9,000; Second Will provides volunteer mentors at \$60,000; Sacramento Self-Help Housing offers housing options and counseling services worth \$10,000; Christian Partnerships, Inc. provides \$52,000 of in-kind services for alcohol and other drug outpatient treatment, nutrition classes, and supplemental food distribution; Sacramento Sheriff's Department in-kind services of \$95,000 for intake assessments for aftercare/re-entry services.

**SUB-GRANTEES:** Sacramento Veteran's Resource Center (\$59,344) for job coaching, job placement and transitional services for an estimated 40 veterans in the program; Second Wind (\$65,795) for overseeing mentoring activities of 100 mentors; Sacramento Self-Help Housing (\$57,740) for job coaching and transitional services to 50 participants; Salvation Army (\$24,150) for job coaching and transitional services to 30 participants; Christian Partnerships, Inc. (\$112,809) for job coaching and transitional services for 80 participants.

**PARTNERS:** Sacramento Employment and Training Agency; Sacramento County Sheriff's Department; California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation; Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency; Sacramento County Department of Health and Human Services Mental Health Division; Second Wind; Sacramento Self-Help Housing; Veteran's Resource Center; Salvation Army; Friendship Housing; and Goodwill Industries.

**OUTCOMES:**

- **Employment Rate:** 60% of clients (120) will enter employment
- **Retention Rate:** 65% (72) of clients placed in jobs will retain employment for at least one year
- **Earnings Change:** 25% earnings increase
- **Recidivism Rate:** 40% reduction in recidivism
