Project Description	Nebraska will operate an industry-driven project designed to connect and prepare participants for employment opportunities in Advanced Manufacturing and Transportation, Distribution, and Logistics (TDL). Program partnerships, partner resources, and industry input will be integrated into a service model to maximize the project's outreach to individuals most in need of reemployment assistance. Nebraska will provide work-based learning through Registered Apprenticeship, on-the-job training and Career Pathways. To support this initiative, the State is targeting up to five percent of the JD NEG funding for employment tools to increase the efficiency of their current reemployment and job matching services.
