<b>Location of Grant Activities</b>	Statewide
<b>Project Description</b>	New York plans to administer a statewide JD NEG project to serve dislocated workers, with a particular focus on the long-term unemployed, Unemployment Insurance recipients profiled as likely to exhaust benefits, veterans, and foreign-trained immigrant worker populations facing barriers to employment. The State plans to provide work-based learning in the form of on-the-job training (OJT) and Registered Apprenticeships, which is customized to the specific needs of businesses in high-demand sectors. The State also plans to leverage the resources provided by the existing American Job Center system to allow program participants to coordinate work-based learning with the established network of services, including job coaching, counseling, and placement assistance for the dislocated worker population. The State further plans to target up to five percent of the JD NEG award to support employment tools such as its newly developed skills matching technology and to expand the use of social media.

<b>Populations to be Served</b>	Dislocated workers that are long-term unemployed; Unemployment Insurance (UI) recipients that have been profiled as likely to exhaust UI benefits; and foreign-trained workers that face barriers in obtaining employment in their trained field or profession, with priority given to recently separated veterans
<b>Partners</b>	Unemployment Insurance; Wagner Peyser; Workforce Investment Act Adult and Dislocated Worker programs (through New York's Career Center System and its case management and tracking system); public assistance programs through the Community Opportunity and Reinvestment Initiative; and economic development initiatives through the Regional Technology Development Center.
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
