



Madison – Inflow Outflow




There are 3,856 primary jobs in the area. Approximately 89% (3,443) of these jobs are done by persons living outside of the area. Area residents work the remaining 413 primary jobs. Additionally, 1,054 residents leave the area for their primary job.

Madison – Distance Direction



The dots on this map illustrate where home is for the area workers. These workers hold 3,856 primary jobs. Thirty-six percent (%) of all workers drive less than 10 miles to get home. Slightly over 41% of all workers drive more than 25 miles to get home.

Madison – Work Area Profile



The map above illustrates where the work locations are for the area jobs. There are 3,856 primary jobs in the area. The next slide details a wide variety of work characteristics of the workers of these jobs including the industry mix of their jobs and a variety of labor force characteristics.



These are the available details for the 3,856 primary jobs in the area. The largest number of workers (18.7%) work in the Retail Trade industry (720 jobs). Approximately 15% of workers work in the Educational Services industry (588 jobs).

Madison – Top 10 Home Destinations



Morgan county is home to the largest group of workers with approximately 40% of Madison workers calling Morgan home. Additionally, 4.7% of workers reside in Greene and approximately 3.9% reside in Walton. These three counties account for approximately 48% of all Madison workers.
