

# Covered Employment Data for Kentucky

## Second Quarter, 2013

Kentucky's covered employment increased by 0.9 percent in the second quarter of 2013 compared to the same period a year ago. Covered employment is now 1,750.1 thousand.

During the recession covered employment declined for nine successive quarters on an over- the-year basis. Beginning with 2010:Q3 employment has increased for eleven consecutive quarters.

“Second quarter” is with reference to the April to June calendar quarter. It is equivalent to the fourth quarter of the state fiscal year.

### Forecast

Data from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) typically lags by five months. The preliminary forecast for the second quarter of 2013 is an internal forecast independent of the US Bureau of Labor Statistics.

### NOTE


Covered employment is defined as the number of employees covered by Unemployment Insurance. It is reported to the states by employers through the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages.

The series is not seasonally adjusted. Hence, it is important to compare the data to the same period a year ago.

The QCEW data are used as the benchmark source for employment by the Current Employment Statistics program and the Occupational Employment Statistics program. The UI administrative records collected under the QCEW program serve as a sampling frame for BLS establishment surveys.
