


## Map of Maryland's Workforce Investment Areas


## Labor Force Statistics

Anne Arundel County Workforce Investment Area (Anne Arundel County WIA) is a single county workforce region, and comprises those different sectors/communities within the county.


The number of residents who entered the labor force during the period including May to June was 2,155. This represented an increase of 0.7% over the month. At the same time 320 people had found jobs increasing the employment level 0.1%. However, the level of those without work increased at a faster rate of 9.5% representing 1,835 additionally unemployed. The end result was an increase in the non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate of 0.5 of a percentage point to 6.8%.




Claims levels for males exceeded those for females by 2.8 of a percent with a 51.4% portion of the file.



About 47.2% of those on file had achieved an education level beyond a high school diploma.


