


# Sioux Falls Area Workforce Report

This report includes information on the inflow and outflow of jobs specifically in the Sioux Falls Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA). Additional information is also provided for the expanded Southeast Region of South Dakota, which includes border counties from several states as detailed in the map below.



Information for the expanded area includes worker inflow and outflow reports, as well as detailed occupational employment and wage information.

This report was prepared by the Labor Market Information Center, South Dakota Department of Labor and Regulation.

## Sioux Falls MSA, Primary Job Count

A count of primary jobs is used to tabulate worker levels. A primary job is the highest paying job for an individual worker for the year; therefore the count of primary jobs is the same as the count of workers.


As of the beginning of second quarter 2010 (most current data available) the inflow, interior and outflow counts for workers in the Sioux Falls MSA were as follows:
